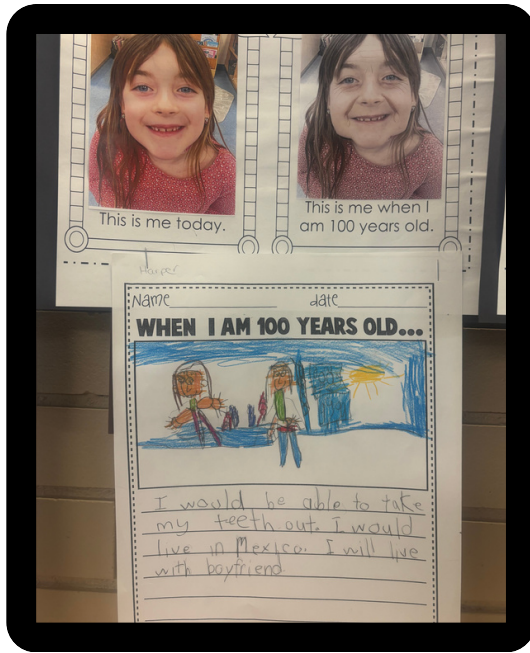
The weekly Toonie Treat, a delightful tradition, is made possible through the dedication of our School Council and parent volunteers.

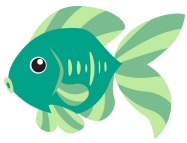

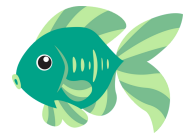
