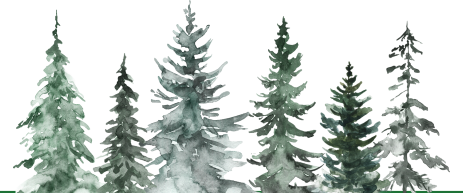

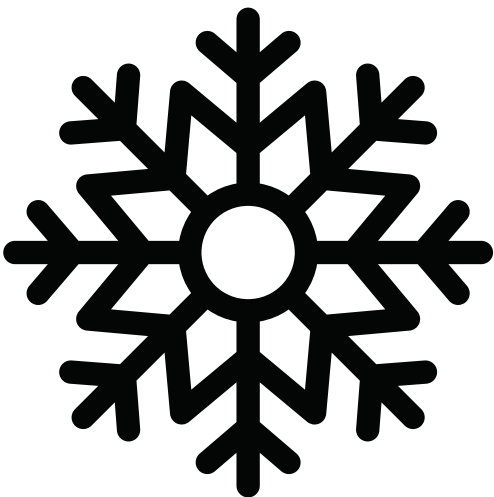

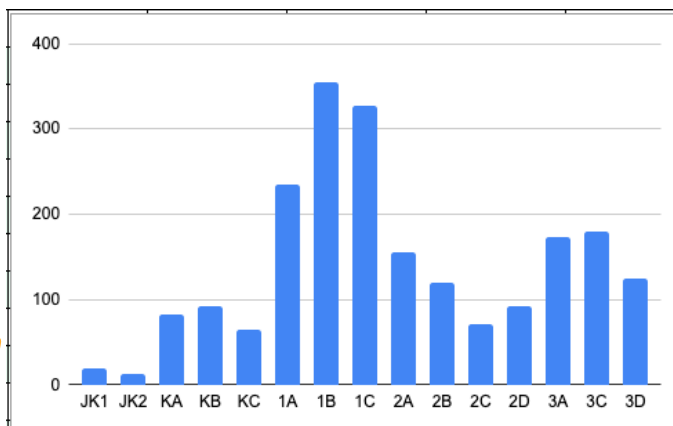
HOMEROOM HEROES

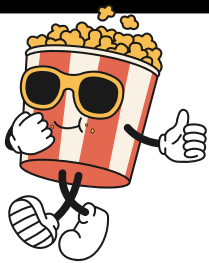

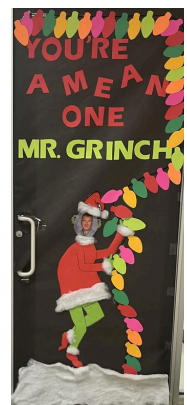
